COURSE SYLLABUS

The aim of the course is to introduce the students history of sociological thought throughout the 20th century. The 19th century background and the passage from it to the twentieth century thought will be slightly touched upon. The couse will continue by discussing structural functionalism as the main current in American sociology, symbolic interactionalism, phenomenology, structuralism, extention of Marxist thought into the 20th century like structural Marxism, Critical theory (the Frankfurt School), and finally end by a prepatory introduction into the postmodernist thought at the later part of the 20th century.

Attendence to the class is a must (15 pnts), besides there will be two midterm exams (25 pnts each) and a final exam (35 pnts). Below you'll find a rough schedule of the course (note: there may be no exact match between the reading material and the dates indicated. Remember, this is a tentative outline).
