# **COURSE SYLLABUS**

The aim of the course is to introduce the students to the history of sociological thought throughout the 20<sup>th</sup> century. The course will start by discussing structural functionalism as the main current in American sociology, symbolic interactionalism, phenomenology, structuralism, extention of Marxist thought into the 20<sup>th</sup> century like structural Marxism, Critical theory (the Frankfurt School), and finally end by a prepatory introduction into the postmodernist thought at the later part of the 20<sup>th</sup> century.

Attendence to the class is a must (**15 pnts**), besides there will be two midterm exams (**25 pnts** each) and a final exam (**35 pnts**).
